# Derbyshire Cricket Foundation Christmas Newsletter Introduction



2021 has been an exceptionally challenging year for all of us, and inevitably the Covid-19 pandemic affected recreational cricket and the work done by our team. It heavily disrupted the 2020/21 winter programme and preparations for the 2021 season. Despite these challenges, I am incredibly proud of the DCF team, our achievements, and those of the wider cricket community. Cricket clubs found creative ways of engaging with their members and raising funds, and our team helped them access over £1m of financial assistance which helped them weather the financial impact of not being able to operate for long periods during the pandemic.

We have worked hard in 2021 to ensure that cricket is a game for everyone, which can be enjoyed in a safe and welcoming environment. I was delighted to be able to increase our support to recreational clubs by appointing our County Safeguarding Officer, Angela Gregson, to the DCF team. We have increased ethnic diversity across all of our programmes, and have taken focussed action to increase the diversity of children, and those from areas of deprivation, participating in our All Stars and Dynamos programmes for young children. Thanks to the fantastic hard work of clubs across the county, the growth of women's cricket has continued, with almost 500 women participating in a record number of Women's softball festivals. We now have more qualified female coaches and volunteers than ever before.

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of our junior and senior leagues and all of our cricket clubs offering junior and senior cricket, the number of fixtures played was up on 2019. Clubs have secured over £300,000 in funding to invest in grassroots cricket. Our coach education programme trained more volunteers than ever before, despite being limited to a shortened 8 month programme, and I know these new coaches will play a key role in sustaining the game moving forward.

Many people in our communities across Derbyshire have been deeply affected during the pandemic. We are committed to supporting these communities, by providing access to activities that can improve the health, well-being, and opportunities for young people. During the summer holidays we delivered a hugely successful play scheme in partnership with Aspire Community and Wrestling Alliance. Over 700 children accessed the programme and took part in over 100 different activity sessions. Crucially, we provided over 1,200 meals to children in Derby City.

We recognise we still have lots to do in our mission to make cricket a game for everyone, and we look forward to working with all our stakeholders as we seek to grow and diversify the game further in 2022.

I would like to take the opportunity to thank all of our volunteers, coaches, officials, players, cricket clubs and organisations that have had such a positive impact in 2021.

From all of us here at the Derbyshire Cricket Foundation, we hope you have a great Christmas and a prosperous New Year!

# **Funding Update**

## ECB County Grants Fund in Derbyshire

Cricket DERBYSHIRE

The ECB County Grants Fund aims to support affiliated cricket clubs to create welcoming environments, provide enhanced facilities and playing opportunities , and to help clubs tackle the impact of climate change. The scheme is open to all affiliated cricket clubs, and it is expected the fund will run until at least 2025.

There are three key themes in the programme:

**Creating Welcoming Environments** – open to affiliated cricket clubs registered for All Stars or Dynamos in 2021, or actively involved with women's and girls' cricket and / or disability cricket. It is an expectation that any junior programme will include and actively engage with girls.

Enhanced Facilities and Playing Opportunities for Women's and Girls' Cricket and / or Disability Cricket – open to affiliated cricket clubs actively engaged in competitive female only cricket and/ or disability cricket.

Tackling Climate Change (supported by Sport England) – Open to any affiliated cricket club.

To assist clubs in identifying where they may need to improve their facilities and to demonstrate why a project is needed ECB has produced the following resources:

The guide and supporting documents have been designed to help all clubs examine their existing facilities and identify areas where improvement works could make a difference to how welcome different users feel when visiting the club. A key aim of the guide is to assist in identifying projects which will remove barriers to participation in cricket and help everyone feel more welcome.

Clubs having read the guidance notes who feel they are eligible to make an application should complete the Expression of Interest Form <u>HERE</u>

# Safe Hands Management Update

## Safe Hands Management System

Having robust safeguarding systems in place is important at all levels of cricket.

To assist clubs, in January 2021 ECB introduced the Safe Hands Management System (SHMS), with the initial rollout being to 37 Clubmark Accredited clubs. The next phase will see all clubs with a junior section added along with any others involved in ECB National Programmes. In Derbyshire this means an additional 45 clubs will be introduced to the system from the end of January 2022.

The SHMS has been designed to help clubs track compliance with safeguarding standards, assisting clubs in ensuring all individuals involved in the running of the club have valid qualifications for their roles. The single central record will bring together IT systems from across the game, sharing information on DBS and Safe Hands Qualifications initially with further qualifications to be added later.

It will also help us at the Derbyshire Cricket Foundation to identify any gaps in safeguarding requirements and ensure cricket is a safe sport that everyone can enjoy.

There are advantages for clubs too, through the platform club administrators will have easy access to all the club's information on safeguarding in one place. Once on the system, clubs will be able to manage safeguarding more effectively, as they will be able to see when DBS checks and safeguarding training needs renewing and updating.

To help ensure a smooth transition onto the SHMS the following will help:

• New clubs on the system should identify a club administrator to act as key contact (often the Club Safeguarding Officer).

• Ensuring those at your club who are in a role requiring a DBS have one in place – the DBS needs to be through cricket.

• Many clubs will have had (or be having) their Annual General Meeting – if you have anyone new in a role requiring a DBS, please get this done as soon as possible.

• Check that your Club Safeguarding Officers Safe Hands qualification is up to date.

• Communicating within the club – tell those within the club who are in a role requiring a cricket DBS that they will be added to the system.

Once clubs have access to the system, it will be the responsibility of the club administrator to confirm club details and add individuals to certain roles. The system will enable club administrators to create contacts and share invites with other members of your club for example Club Chair, Coaches or Welfare Officers. Clubs can have additional club administrators to help share the workload if needed.

We will shortly be in contact with new clubs who are scheduled to be added to the SHMS portal to request contact details for your club administrator. Support from the Derbyshire Cricket Foundation will be available through your Club & Community Cricket Officer.



## Safeguarding Courses

## Training Update for Club Safeguarding Officers (CSO's)

As a reminder Club Safeguarding Officers are required to attend two sets of training:

- Safeguarding and Protecting Children (SPC) course run by UK Coaching
- An ECB 'Safe Hands' workshop which is run by Derbyshire Cricket Foundation Ltd.

Every three years, the requirements above must be updated.

In addition, all CSO's must also have a current ECB DBS which should ideally be on the DBS Update Service. It is preferable that the SPC course is attended before completing the Safe Hands workshop.

Important to note that the Safe Hands workshop will be "Face to Face" however there is an online option for the SPC course – see training options below.

To fulfil training needs and be compliant with the Safe Hands Management System a CSO must have evidence of completing both courses.

SPC Training is a UK Coaching course with the options as follows:

- New CSO's can attend an Online Classroom course or "Face to Face" workshop ( please note due to Covid only a few "Face to Face" courses are currently available). The cost of the online classroom course is £30 and can be booked <u>HERE</u>

- Existing CSO's needing to renew Safeguarding Training have an eLearning option course Renewal: Safeguarding & Protecting Children. The cost of this course is £16.99 and is available <u>HERE</u>

# DCF Development League & Good News Stories

## DCF Development League

The step up from junior cricket to senior cricket can be a daunting one for a young player, involving longer games, players of all ages, a reduced role within the team and often longer travel times.

Due to feedback from clubs about the continued problem of transitioning junior players into senior cricket we decided to offer our support and in 2021 we introduced the DCF Development League.

We kept the rules as simple as possible but crucially allowed clubs flexibility to rearrange fixtures, change start times and the number of overs played to cater for the players. We also encouraged team managers/ captains to speak to the opposition before games to discuss the upcoming fixture. We aimed to create an environment that would allow junior players to play longer format games without the pressures that can be associated with Saturday league cricket.

We had 14 teams involved who we split into 3 divisions based on geography to limit travel time with teams playing both home and away. We also worked with the ACO to provide an umpire at each game to distinguish it from a club friendly game.

The overall feedback has been very positive, and we have 20 teams signed up to be involved in the 2022 season.

# Schools Cricket & Club Support

## Chance to Shine and Schools

It has been another extraordinary year for our delivery of the Chance to Shine programme and other school activity. With the schools being closed for half the academic year, we had to adapt our plans to ensure we delivered what we set out to. We also created new risk assessments and operational plans to ensure that everyone involved in the school sessions were safe. Through our adaptability and planning, we still managed to engage 12,000 children in primary schools throughout the County. These participants were made up of KS1 and KS2 students and schools were targeted to support clubs National Programmes.

Unfortunately, due to Covid, we were unable to run our successful KS1/2 Festivals last year, however, this year we are planning for these to return so we can engage more children in cricket activity. This year, for the first time, we also managed to run a new Girls Secondary Cricket Programme.

This Chance to Shine programme has been designed to create opportunities for teenage girls to play cricket and to support them to develop leadership skills through the sport. We delivered afterschool clubs, taster sessions and leadership training to 3 schools in Derbyshire, we are looking to increase this to 4 in 2022.

Community Coach, Jack Richardson, also shared what his year has been like as part of the Chance to Shine Schools Programme:



"Our Chance to Shine programmes this year have been very successful. We have delivered the programme across the county to a range of schools. This year we have delivered Whole School Programmes and Engagement Days. Children have really enjoyed the sessions and teachers have noted the improvement in the children's skills.

We have also been working to help upskill the teachers at the schools we visit so once the coaches finish the programme at the school, the teachers are able to continue to promote cricket. We are always looking for new schools to join the programme as we want to try a deliver cricket across the county to as many children as possible."

# Holiday Programmes & Club Support

## Holiday Programme

Thankfully this year we were able to bring back our holiday programme running 12 courses throughout the County during the summer. These included a mixture of hardball and softball courses as well as 2 girls only. We also managed to acquire funding to pay for 60 free places for children from deprived backgrounds, giving opportunities for children who wouldn't usually be able to access the courses.

Community Coach, Joe Wilson, told us a little about his year of delivering on our holiday programmes and 1-1 coaching sessions:

"This year we managed to run five weeks worth of summer camps, during that time we ran two camps per week. The numbers at these camps were good, which meant plenty of children were learning different cricket skills whilst having fun. Furthermore we ran junior and mini falcons courses on a Wednesday and Friday night which 90 children attended. We received some great feedback from parents and children!

Finally, our 1-1 programme has been running on Saturday mornings and has been well attended with all the coaches busy working with a range of players to help them improve skills no matter their ability."

## **Table Cricket**

Disability cricket has continued to grow within Derbyshire and we hope that this continues to grow while we work closely with the Lord Taverners.

Due to Covid we sadly had to cancel all of our 2021 cricket competitions, but we were able to start going into SEND schools from October. Even with the pandemic still affecting how everything runs, we still managed to deliver cricket sessions within 10 schools.



We currently have two table cricket competitions booked for the new year at the Derbyshire County Cricket Club; Monday 24th January and Wednesday 26th January 2022. We are looking to host another in the Chesterfield area around February/March time.

#### Super 1s

Super1s has now come to Derbyshire, in partnership with the Lord Taverners! This amazing programme provides an opportunity for 12–25-year-olds with disabilities to play regular and competitive cricket. This is also a place to learn and develop new life skills as well as making new friends.

We have two community hubs ready to go in the new year, the first one is at Alfreton Leisure Centre on a Friday night starting on the 28th January 2022.

- 4pm 5pm is for 12–17-year-olds
- 5-6pm is for 18 25 year olds.

Our Second hub is going to be at Shirebrook Academy in the Bolsover District on a Thursday afternoon starting on Thursday 3rd March 2022.

- 3:30pm 4:30pm is for 12-17 year olds
- 4:30pm 5:30pm is for 18-25 year olds

We are looking to set up another hub in Derby within the next year.

#### **Derbyshire Disabled CC**

The Derbyshire disabled teams are all really looking forward to the 2022 season! Their winter training will be starting at Derbyshire County Cricket Club on some Tuesday Evenings, starting on Tuesday 18th January. The DCF will be working closely with the club to support them as much as possible.

## Women's Softball Festivals

In 2021 Derbyshire Cricket Foundation ran 17 Women's Softball Festivals, a record amount which attracted a record number of Women and Girls into the game! For those that don't know, the below will tell you what our festivals are all about!

To enter a festival, all you need to do is find seven other women, form a team and register! It's that simple! All abilities are welcome, and the equipment will be provided. Team registrations are completely free of charge. These festivals are ideal for clubs who have new players who want to experience cricket in a fun, safe and social environment!

The game is played with a softer ball (hard foam centre), so it means no pads, helmets etc are required! The rules are very simple and designed to get every team member involved! In your team of eight, each pair bat for two overs (12 balls) and if you are given out, your team simply loses five runs, but remain in! Ideally each player in your team will bowl; overarm, or underarm!

## Women's Indoor League

DCF have ran two Women's Softball Indoor Leagues in 2021 for 12 different clubs/teams!

These ran out of Willows Sports centre again, who have not only run an outstanding indoor cricket facility but have also been fantastic hosts for DCF and the women's teams involved. It's been a difficult 18 months for the centre, but DCF are very glad to be using them again!

The leagues have both had 6 teams who played each other twice, meaning 10 matches per team. Each league took place over 5 weeks on Sunday afternoons. The format is similar to traditional indoor cricket but with less overs in order to get more games in a shorter period of time.

8 teams (4 in each league) were new teams to be involved in indoor cricket. This is great for our indoor offer going forward and ensures more teams are involved in Women's Cricket over the winter months.

The first of these leagues had teams from Eckington, Long Eaton, Belper Meadows, Matlock, Ashbourne, and Chellaston. Long Eaton won this league winning 9 out of their 10 games! Close runners up were Belper Meadows, who lost their final game against the eventual winners in an exciting last game of the competition. Belper finished with a very good, 8 wins out of 10.



The 2nd of these leagues featured teams from Clowne Town, Ilkeston Rutland, Clifton, Sandiacre, Darley Abbey, and Hilton. Ilkeston Rutland finished winners of the league winning 9 out of their 10 games! Runners up on run difference were Sandiacre, winning 6 out of their 10 games.

Congratulations to Long Eaton CC and Ilkeston Rutland CC on their wins! As well as all of the teams involved! We hope you all enjoyed it!

The Derbyshire Cricket Foundation will be running a girls U12's league in 2022. This format ran in 2021 with some success, we had 10 teams enter from across the county who played 4/5 games across the summer. Recently we have spoken to a number of clubs and conducted a review of Girls club cricket and decided now is the time to introduce a county wide playing offer for girls. The offer will begin as the next league offer after Girls U9 Kwik Cricket that is currently offered by most junior leagues.

What does the competition look like?

- U12 age group and below (Year 5/6/7)
- 5 match days on Sundays across the summer
- 2/3 games on a day
- DCF to organise Fixtures/ Results on Play Cricket
- 16 over matches
- 8-a-side pairs format
- Incredi-ball
- Flexibility around fixtures and player registration
- Clubs required to have a key adult contact for match days.



Clubs are free to team up with one other local club if they wish, in order to get a full team out. We can help facilitate this process if needs be. Please let us know. They must register the team under one of the two club names.

We will look to create the fixtures so there are 3 or 4 teams at a venue on a given day to play 2 games each. Fixtures dates and expression of interest will be sent out in the new year!

# Women & Girls Performance Pathway

With no winter training due to another lockdown, but a record number of girls, we eventually started outdoor training in April. The good thing was that cricket actually started on time, as planned, but alas still no teas! Below is a brief resume of our season:

#### Senior Women

The Women's County Championship is now limited to four T20 days of cricket and unfortunately, we lost a day and a half to the weather. We did play 5 games though, winning 2 and losing 3. Bethan Ellis was the leading run scorer with 140 at an average of 70 and Suzie Ljubojevic finished as leading wicket-taker with 5.

## U18 Girls

The U18 Girls played 11 games, winning 5, losing 5 with 1 being tied. Lara Shaw was the leading run scorer with 222 and Jess Thatcher leading wicket taker with 13.



#### U15 Girls

Our U15's won 7 and lost 5 of their 12 games. The leading run scorers in 2021 were Harriet Parkin (378 runs) and Jess Smithurst (320 runs) with Zaara Farhan finishing leading wicket taker with 21 wickets.

### U13 Girls

On top of some Intra County games our U13's played 10 fixtures against other Counties, winning 4 and losing 6. Maria Andrews led the batting with 138 runs, 2 bowlers finished with 5 wickets each, Holly Reeves and Sophia McCollum.



### U11 Girls

The U11's also played a number of Intra County games and also 7 games against other Counties, winning 2 and losing 5. The leading run scorer was Holly Mayfield with 108 runs and the leading bowler was Phoebe Blurton with 8 wickets.

A huge thanks to Belper Amateurs, Belper Meadows, Brailsford and Ednaston, Charlesworth and Chisworth, Clifton, Cutthorpe, Denby, Duffield, Hilton, Ilkeston Rutland, Lullington, Marehay, Matlock, Melbourne, Mickleover, Nutbrook, Ockbrook and Borrowash, Rolleston, Sandiacre Town, Spondon, and Ticknall who all came forward to host training and/or fixtures.

In November, Harriett Parkin was selected for Lightning Academy and Zaara Farhan, Lara Shaw, and Jess Smithurst were selected for Lightning EPP, congratulations to all of them on their achievement.

Our plans are now in place for 2022 and winter training has already started in the Indoor Performance Centre at the Incora County Ground with again a record number of 154 girls involved!



## All Stars & Dynamos Cricket

## All Stars Cricket

With the disruptions regarding covid we didn't really know what to expect in 2021. It turned out to be another excellent year for All Stars Cricket with 62 Derbyshire Centres and 1816 children aged 5-8 introduced to the game of Cricket.

We once again had a high number of girls involved in our programmes with 478 female participants (26%) and we now have 33 trained female Activators to lead sessions and be female role models.

Another success from 2021 were the 5 inner city programmes that we ran for children from a deprived background in Bolsover and Derby City. In total we had 196 children access All Stars Cricket for free thanks to Funds4Runs and Sky funding.

### Dynamos Cricket

2021 saw the launch of the ECB's brand new initiative, Dynamos Cricket. Dynamos Cricket offers children aged 8-11 a programme that has been designed to complement existing junior club cricket with 8 weeks of skills and games of countdown cricket with links to The Hundred.

We had 37 Derbyshire centres run in 2021 with 757 children taking part which was a great effort under the circumstances in its first year of running. We again had a high number of girls involved with 29% of participants being female. A big bonus of Dynamos Cricket is the option to run a girls only programme which could be very beneficial in developing a women and girls section at a cricket club.

# Community Projects & Events

2021 has been an interesting year for the Derbyshire Cricket Foundation and in particular the work we have done within the community. Coming back after lockdown and restrictive measures left us wondering how to get back on track. However, one thing remained clear, bringing people together in a safe way and getting back out into the community was paramount.

## Winter Wellness Workshops: January 2021- June 2021

The Winter Wellness was a collaborative piece working with the Move More Derby ambassador network. We ran monthly virtual meetings based on a variety of hot topics that delivered useful and knowledgeable information to keep people healthy and active over the winter period. The overall aim of the project was to improve mental and physical wellbeing by connecting with other people during COVID restrictions paying particular attention to those who perhaps were feeling isolated and lonely.

We covered a wide range of different subjects from Sleep, Wellbeing, Active Travel, Walking and Women's Health. Working with such fantastic and inspiring partners such as FiiT for Life, Bridge the Gap, Sustrans, Beat the Street, GoodGym, Livewell, Walx Derwent and Dales, Derby Active and Derby City Sport Forum.

#### T20 Walkathon: July 2021

The Walkathon fundraiser was back for 2021 with a different route. Usually, the 20-mile walk would take us from Trent Bridge to Derbyshire's Incora County Ground through the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Countryside. This year we decided to explore Derbyshire by taking a circular route around the local cricket grounds, setting off from Derbyshire's ground heading out to Breadsall, Spondon, Ockbrook, Alvaston and finishing (hopefully) in time to settle into the Derbyshire vs Worcestershire T20 match with a well-earned drink or two. The club took place over two sites, one at Derwent Primary School and the other at Aspire's Community Centre where children could submerge themselves into the world of WWE style wrestling. The holiday club was specifically aimed at children between the ages of 5-11 who were in receipt of free school meals.

With funding from the DFE food and activity fund, The Woodward Trust, the ASDA Foundation and the DCF we were able to offer 60 places per day with lunch and breakfast. At the end of the four weeks, we celebrated in style by having a trip to Yorkshire Wildlife Park, however I think someone forgot to tell the animals that we were coming!

The Holiday Club was jam packed with activities from start to finish cramming in football, basketball, a climbing wall, the circus, Cycle Derby, a steel band, animals and even a special visit from children's entertainer Geoffrey Jumper.

We are delighted to announce that as part of the funding we received, there was a commitment from us to run another holiday club during the Christmas holidays. Therefore, we will be back from 4th January to 7th January 2022 at Breadsall Hilltop Primary School, delivering more activities and creating more life long memories.
