## EQUITY, DIVERSITY & INCLUSION

Cricket is a game for everyone. It can connect communities and improve lives, and help bring people from diverse backgrounds together. At the Derbyshire Cricket Foundation (DCF) we also recognise the reality is that for too many people, that hasn't always been the case. Some have faced barriers to participation, and others have not felt welcome. Widening participations in cricket and inspiring a generation to say "cricket is a game for me" has been the cornerstone of the DCF strategy for several years. Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) is therefore integral and imperative to our core purpose. It is our responsibility to identify barriers that may prevent people accessing the game or feeling welcome, and take action to address them.

Our 2023 Equity, Diversity & Inclusion (EDI) Plan will strive to grow the game by creating inclusive environments, removing barriers to participation, tackling discrimination, and widening participation among under-represented groups. We will actively support the England & Wales Cricket Board (ECB) 12 point plan to tackle racism and promote diversity and inclusion across cricket, including the deployment of the ECB Anti-Discrimination Code. This document outlines the high-level actions we will take this year, and covers 4 key themes:

## COMBATTING DISCRIMINATION

### Commitment/Action

1) Support all clubs and leagues across Derbyshire in adopting the ECB Anti-Discrimination Code in advance of the 2024 season.

2) Promote participation in on-line EDI training among officials and participants across grassroots clubs and leagues in Derbyshire.

3) Establish a process for monitoring alleged breaches of the Anti-Discrimination Code (ADC).

4) Establish an Anti-Discrimination Support Panel to assist clubs and leagues effectively manage any alleged breaches of the Anti-Discrimination Code.

## WELCOMING & INCLUSIVE CLUBS

### Commitment/Action

- 1) Provide County Grant Funding to support clubs developing more welcoming and sustainable facilities, which support wider participation in cricket.
- 2) Provide clubs with an easy-to-use "toolkit" that will inform local action planning to create more welcoming and inclusive clubs.
- 3) Provide clubs with additional best-practice guidance and resources to enable more welcoming environments.
- 4) Establish an on-line survey template to help clubs gather feedback from members on how welcome they feel.
