Equity, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) is therefore integral and imperative to our core purpose. It is our responsibility to identify barriers that may prevent people accessing the game or feel welcome, and take action to address them.

In November 2023 we published our 7 commitments to making cricket A Game for Everyone and we embarked on a consultation to help shape our 2024 action plan. We heard the views and lived experiences of a wide range of stakeholders which has been invaluable in shaping our plans.

Our 2024 Equity, Diversity and Inclusion plan will strive to grow the game by creating inclusive environments, removing barriers to participation, tackling discrimination, and widening participation among under-represented groups.
